
OBEY YOUR NOODLY MASTER

THE ROOT BELIEF OF PASTAFARIANISM IS "WHAT ARE WE FOR? ALL THAT IS GOOD! WHAT ARE WE AGAINST? ALL THAT IS NOT GOOD!" HOW DOES THIS COMPARE TO YOUR UNDERSTANDING OF OUR CHRISTIAN BELIEFS? IS IT SUFFICIENT FOR FAITH?

ALL FOLLOWERS OF THE FSM HOLD THAT PIRATES ARE SACRED AND WERE THE FIRST PASTAFARIANS. BESIDES, THIS ISN'T ABOUT THEM SO DON'T CHANGE THE SUBJECT." WHAT DO YOU THINK ABOUT THAT SUGGESTION?

Another is "I'd really rather you didn't use my existence as a means to oppress, subjugate, punish, eviscerate, and/or, you know, be mean to others. I don't require sacrifices and purity is for drinking water, not people." Is purity really only for drinking water? Do you think religion is used as an excuse for power?
